ROADS, AUSTRALIAS MOST VALUABLE ASSET


Australia’s roads have never been more critical to the country’s strategic and economic success. Throughout unpredictable and catastrophic natural weather events and the recent pandemic, Australia’s critical road network has proven to be one of its hardest working assets, keeping communities and businesses connected and safe.

Roads are the lifeline for connectivity across the country – they are critical to connecting communities and supporting Australian supply chains and freight. Australia’s road sector contributes \$236 billion to the economy annually, and employs 630 thousand workers. Well maintained roads are essential to ensuring the safety of our citizens, the resilience of our communities and our local and global economic edge. Australia’s total road length comprises of over 877,000 kilometres.

The value of roads has most recently been highlighted by flooding events across Queensland and Northern NSW, during this period Australia’s roads protected lives by aiding emergency services and supported the economy connecting our producers with markets at home and abroad.

During the recent pandemic, roads also facilitated e-commerce and food delivery, and brought families and loved ones together when restrictions eased. The 2021 State of the Assets report estimates that of all local roads, which make up 77% of Australia’s total road length, 8% of sealed roads and 14% of unsealed roads are in poor condition, function and capacity and close to reaching the end of their useful life. With a total replacement cost of \$204bn these figures highlight the critical need for healthy, sustainable pipelines of maintenance across the nation.

For these reasons, there has never been a better time to get involved with the flexible pavement industry.



WHAT IS THE FLEXIBLE PAVEMENT INDUSTRY?

The Australian flexible pavement industry is a multi-billion-dollar industry at the forefront of critical road infrastructure projects across Australia, which underpin the nation's economic growth. The industry is comprised of both large infrastructure multinationals as well as local Australian small to medium businesses.

The flexible pavement industry is directly involved in the delivery of vital road maintaining infrastructure projects across metropolitan and rural Australia. However, flexible pavement doesn't just mean roads, the industry provides the critical infrastructure Australia relies on, including airport runways, ports, busways, railway access tracks, car parks and much more.




SUSTAINABILITY

VERSATILITY






WHY AfPA?

INNOVATION AND MAINTENANCE:

AfPA maintains a resolve to incorporate technological, practical and educational innovations wherever possible in its activities and guidance of the industry and members. As an industry directly involved in the safety of Australian motorists and road workers, the need for innovation is ever-present and crucial to better roads. AfPA upholds a continual improvement culture across industry and government in engineering and construction practice, safety and sustainability. AfPA advocates for the utilisation of existing road safety technology to reduce speeds and keep workers safe.

Beyond road workers, safety incidents on roads are major concern for AfPA, taking an unacceptable number of lives each year – despite being a key focus for government. A key objective for AfPA and our members is to enable and support industry to continuously improve the health and safety of our people and communities we serve.



EDUCATION AND ADVOCACY:

AfPA works to enhance and upgrade the training, skills and resources of our members and the industry more generally. AfPA provides safety training courses and works to provide educational resources which promote best practice. We hold a firm commitment to actively trial and adopt innovative technology solutions that enhance safety of road workers and the public. Critically, we keep the mental and physical wellbeing of the industry as a top priority, providing resources and education to ensure our industry works efficiently and safely. AfPA also provides training, tech talks and master classes with leading national and international experts

AfPA works with industry to ensure an understanding of bitumen and how to work safely with it. AfPA supports members to implement management processes which address any long-term worker related health risks arising from air pollution and particulates (produced at the point of manufacture and through the supply chain). AfPA has developed a suite of training resources targeting worker safety, capability and capacity but also offer vocational qualifications which are transferable across the whole industry.
